

# INsight® Risk Assessment for the Emergency Department

## Fast, effective way to assess risks

ECRI Institute's web-based risk assessment provides perspectives from the front-line to leadership to help the organization assess risks in the Emergency Department. Reports are generated based on assessment results to help identify opportunities so you can focus on improvements.

## Sample Questions

- ▶ Is a clinical staff member able to see the waiting room from the triage area at all times? (Staffing and Resources)
- ▶ How effective is the process of transferring a pregnant woman from the Emergency Department to the mother baby unit or labor floor? (Transfer Procedures and EMTALA)
- ▶ Emergent clinical findings are communicated to a qualified medical provider at the time of triage. (Communication and Information Flow)
- ▶ The triage process in the emergency department is periodically evaluated. (Triage and Observation)
- ▶ An EKG is obtained immediately on patients who arrive with complaints of chest pain. (High Risk Emergency Conditions)
- ▶ Radiology services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. (Availability of Specialty Services)
- ▶ Staff know the procedure to follow when abuse is suspected in patients of all ages. (Staff Competency and Education)
- ▶ There is a process in place for patient follow-up when there is a discrepancy between the emergency physician's initial radiology interpretation and the radiologist's final interpretation. (Adequate Follow Up)
- ▶ Patients who wish to leave the emergency department against medical advice (AMA) are required to sign a form. (Obtaining Authorization and Consent)
- ▶ How effective are the systems in place that help to prevent the emergency department from becoming overcrowded? (Patient Flow and Wait Times)
- ▶ Strict protocols are followed to ensure patients are identified before treatment. (Patient Safety and Incident Response)
